

Import Photos to Your Mac

In this tutorial, we will import photos from a camera to a Mac computer using the application **Image Capture**. Image Capture is included as part of your basic Mac operating system.

Step 1: Connect your camera to your Mac computer

1. Plug the smaller end of a *mini USB* cord into the camera where it says *AV/OUT DIGITAL*.



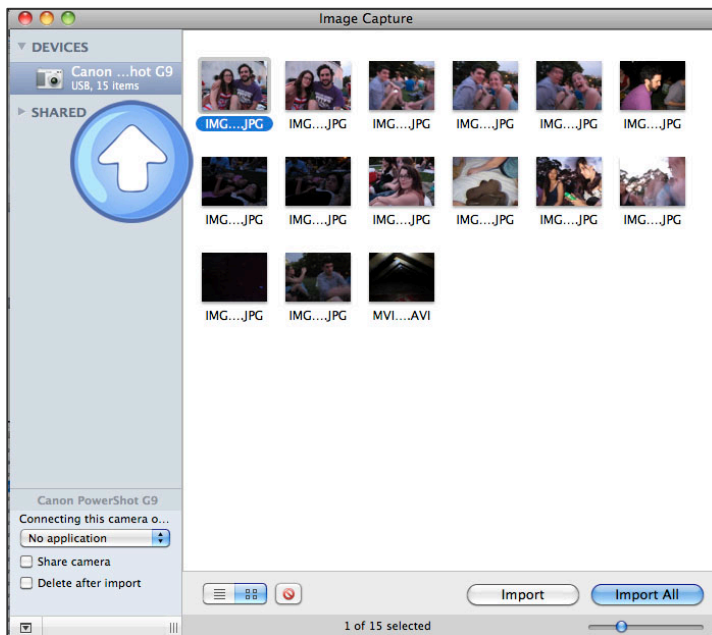
2. Plug the larger end of the *mini USB cord* into your Mac.



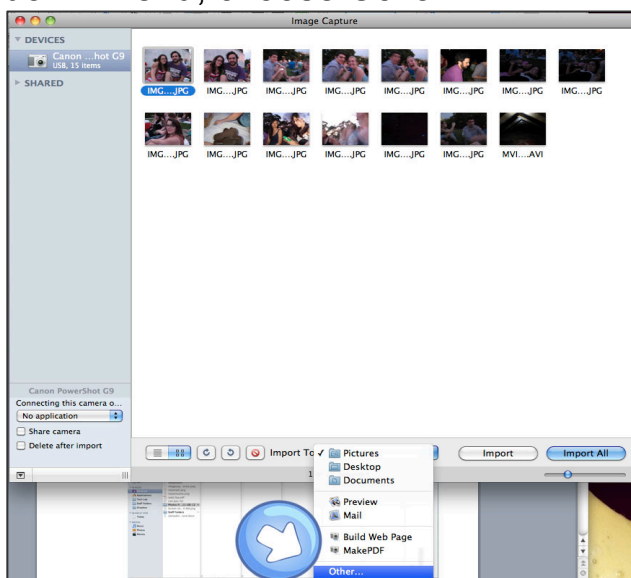
3. Turn on the camera.

Step 2: Import your photos

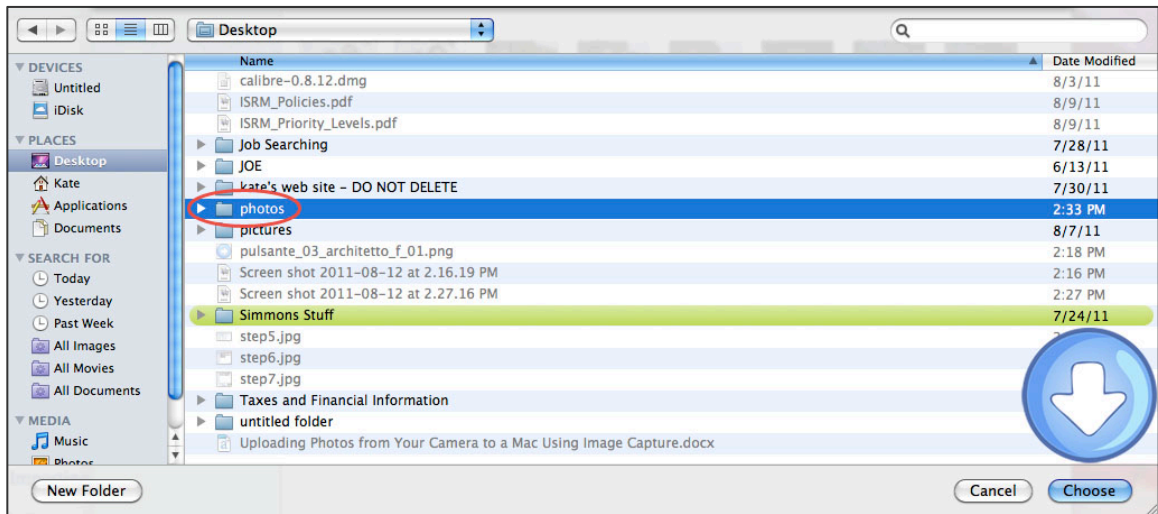
1. Using the Finder, in the *Applications* folder, **click *Image Capture***. *Image Capture* will open.
2. Under *Devices*, the *Image Capture* program will automatically list your camera. (If your camera does not appear, try shutting off your camera and turning it back on.)



3. At the bottom of the *Image Capture* window, from the *Import to* drop-down menu, choose ***Other...***



4. Navigate to the folder where you would like to save your photos. To create a new folder, click **New Folder** and give it a name. Once you have selected your folder, click **Choose**.



5. To import all of the images on your camera, click **Import All**. To import only some of the images on your camera, select the images and click **Import**. Note: You can select more than one image at a time by holding down the **Command** key.

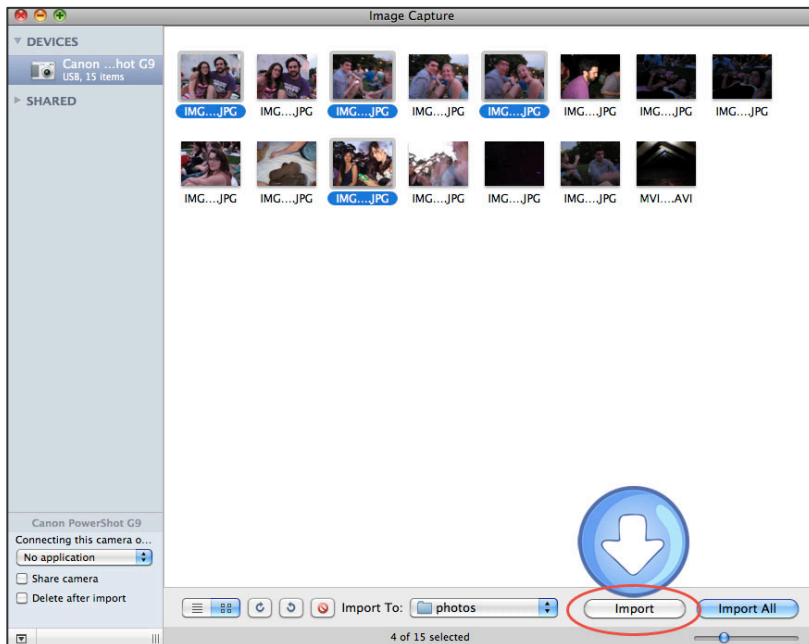


Image Capture will import your photos to the selected folder.
